## 2. Form, Style and Placement in Administrative Code

- a. In the definition of "southern chub fishing zone," the word "and," at the beginning of the underscored material, should be replaced by the phrase "except that."
  - b. In s. NR 25.05 (1) (d), the rule is inconsistent in referring to "water" versus "waters."

# ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD AMENDING RULES

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board adopts an order to amend NR 25.02(25) FH-44-98 and 25.05(1)(d) relating to commercial fishing for chubs on Lake Michigan

### Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 29.085, 29.174(3), 29.33(1) and 227.11 (2)(a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.085, 29.174(2)(a) and 29.33(1), Stats.

Under current rules no commercial chub fishing may occur at depths less than 60 fathoms during the winter fishing period, January 16 through the end of February. This rule revision opens waters of the northern chub fishing zone shallower than 60 fathoms but deeper than 55 fathoms to chub fishing during the winter period of license years 1998-1999 and 1999-2000.

This rule revision also expands the area open to chub fishing to the north of the current southern chub fishing zone during the 1998-1999 and 1999-2000 license years. By revising the definition of the southern chub fishing zone, it allows chub fishing during the winter periods of those years in water 60 fathoms deep or deeper north of the current southern chub fishing zone but south of a line extending east of the entrance of Algoma harbor.

### SECTION 1. NR 25.02(25) is amended to read:

NR 25.02(25) "Southern chub fishing zone" means those waters of Lake Michigan lying south of a line extending east from the entrance of Kewaunee harbor to its intersection with the 45 fathom (270 feet) depth contour, then proceeding northerly along the 45 fathom depth contour to its intersection with 44°32' north latitude, then proceeding east along 44°32' north latitude to its intersection with the Wisconsin-Michigan state line and, from January 16 to the end of February during the 1998-1999 and 1999-

waters of Lake Michigan lying south of a line extending east from the entrance of Kewaunee harbor to its intersection with the 45 fathom (270 feet) depth contour, then proceeding northerly along the 45 fathom depth contour to its intersection with a line extending east from the entrance of Algoma harbor, then proceeding east along a line from the entrance of Algoma harbor to its intersection with the Wisconsin-Michigan state line.

#### REPORT TO LEGISLATURE

NR 25.02 and 25.50, Wis. Adm. Code Commercial fishing for chubs on Lake Michigan

Board Order No. FH-44-98 Clearinghouse Rule No. 98-095

### Statement of Need

Under current rules no commercial chub fishing may occur at depths less than 60 fathoms during the winter fishing period, January 16 through the end of February. This rule opens waters of the northern chub fishing zone shallower than 60 fathoms but at least 55 fathoms deep to chub fishing during the winter period of license years 1998-1999 and 1999-2000. This rule also expands the area open to chub fishing to the north of the current southern chub fishing zone during the 1998-1999 and 1999-2000 license years. By revising the definition of the southern chub fishing zone, it allows chub fishing during the winter periods of those years in water 60 fathoms deep or deeper north of the current southern chub fishing zone but south of a line extending east of the entrance of Algoma harbor.

Current chub fishing zone boundaries and depth restrictions are designed to protect lake trout from excessive incidental harvest. Under current regulations, the incidental lake trout kill is high, exceeding 35,000 fish annually, but probably consistent with the lakewide lake trout restoration objectives adopted by the four states on Lake Michigan. The expanded fishing opportunities provided by the proposed rule change would result in an additional loss of lake trout of only a few hundred fish, at most.
