By this time my local representative
Scrattie may have contacted you,
on my behalf, as I just now
found a document that informed
me of the existence of your Committee.
In case Rep. Scrattie has not
yet been in contact with you
I state my case:

As a part of this year just as
in past April, the DNR & Housewives,
Congress held joint hearings in
each county on issues, rules &
laws regarding (mostly) hunting
& fishing. Some few years ago
at a similar meeting the DNR
proposed changing the bass
fishing rules so that such
bass fishing north of St Hwy 64
would be catch & release only
until June 20. It was voted
down but the DNR instituted
the rule anyhow. The rule is
totally useless, has been proven

so by the most prestigious & knowledgeable bass authorities in the world. Even the most pro-vice bass authority knows that bass spawn according to water temperature, and to protect those spawning bass was supposedly the reason for the catch & release only rule. However, since the lakes & streams south of 64 warm sooner the bass are in full spawn there while the season is wide open. So this excuse is invalid for that reason, and because most bass fishermen release their bass anyhow, that also falls short as a reason. We in the north already have a shortened season due to late ice-out & earlier freeze-up, our chances of a "trophy" are very limited. Since some 30% of the lakes & 75% of the population live south of 64, the pressure on those southern lakes is tremendous.

Once more, pressure on northern lakes is not a valid excuse. In the weeks preceding this year's meetings the DNR proposed eliminating the rule, as, by their own admission, it served no purpose & was useless. The vote again favored eliminating the rule. However, the latest announcement by the DNR is that they will keep the rule anyhow. Why? Well you'll get various bureaucratize explanations, but the real reason is because an organized political contributing group wants it. Well financed & having voice with the media, resort owners etc. This is the guides assoc. I know several of them & they freely admit they would force the DNR to keep the rule. Why? Because, at the time bass are spawning, they & walleye occupy virtually the same structure & water areas and

The guides don't want 'those damn bass fishermen' fishing on "our" lakes. They even went so far in this county (Marinette) used a tactic labor unions has done in the past. They kept bringing up trivial items at the spring meeting until most people had to leave, then held a vote (I think barely 4 to 6 people were left) and voted to instruct the Conservation Congress to recommend that High Falls Reservoir be left out of the rule repeal if the DNR were to ~~repeal~~ repeal the rule. Obviously that's not necessary if the rule is kept. There is no reason except political pay-back to keep this rule.

I ask you to take this up at the earliest possible moment, as the DNR has a habit of printing & publishing next year's rules even before they are approved by the legislature, they will face you with a done deal. Thank you

RE: July 21 Hearing on Budget Amendments offered by Rep. Lorraine Serrati for Natural Resources Revisions to Navigable Permit Application Process and Requirements

The American Water Ski Association (AWSA), the National Show Ski Association (an AWSA Sport Division) and the affiliated Wisconsin Water Ski Federation would like to be on record as favoring the Budget Amendments being offered by State Rep. Lorraine Serrati and scheduled for hearing before members of the Senate on July 21. In a time when public mood is calling for smaller, more responsive government, the Budget Amendments being offered relative to Navigable Permit Application Process and Requirements present a governmental attitude that represents enlightenment and common sense.

Show skiing has long been a highlight of Wisconsin outdoor sports and tourism. The shows are highly popular and often draw thousands of people per performance. The famous Tommy Bartlett Show at Wisconsin Dells and our 30 AWSA-affiliated show ski clubs have provided summer-time entertainment and represented a sizable economic impact for Wisconsin tourism for more than half a century. Tommy Bartlett is a member of the American Water Ski Hall of Fame. Additionally, safety is always a primary concern of AWSA and its members, and we feel that the proposed Amendments are sound in that area and in other aspects involving show skiing activities. Specifically, we support the following provisions contained in the proposed amendments:

1. That the amendments require the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to promulgate rules establishing a clear list of what may constitute a "substantive objection" to a permit for construction or placement of certain structures in navigable waters. That the amendments requires individuals who object to the permit to be parties to the contested case hearing and to pay for all costs associated with the hearing, if the permit to which they object is approved. That the amendments require the DNR to grant a permit within thirty days of receipt of the permit application unless the DNR determines that a hearing is necessary due to a substantive objective. That the DNR must schedule a hearing within thirty days of determining that a hearing is required.
2. That the amendments would delete the requirement that the DNR may "provide notice to other persons as it deems necessary." The DNR is required to promulgate rules to include the following information in a notice of public hearing for a navigable water permit. 1.) Definition of substantive objection; 2.) The DNR may reject a request for a hearing; 3.) The objectors to a permit must pay all hearing costs if the permit is granted; 4.) The right to appeal the decision of an Administrative Law Judge. (We would note that under current law, certain wharves, piers, and swimming rafts can be constructed without a DNR permit if the structures do not interfere with other individual rights in navigable waters and other riparian owners.)
3. That these amendments also include provisions to exclude water ski platforms and water ski jumps from permit requirements if the structures do not interfere with public rights in navigable waters, the structures do not interfere with the rights of other riparian proprietors, and the structures are located in a manner to assure the appropriate depth and clearance space for safe performance.

4. And that the amendment exempts water skiers or boat drivers who are active members of a water ski club from the prohibition of operating within 100 feet of any dock, raft, pier or buoyed restricted area on any lake at a speed in excess of slow, no-wake speed.

The American Water Ski Association is the non-profit national governing body of organized skiing. We have 30,000 members throughout the United States and are affiliated with the United States Olympic Committee and the Pan American Sports Organization.

We encourage members of the Senate to view the proposed amendments favorably. Such consideration would be most welcome. Our show ski teams and the Wisconsin Water Ski Federation have, in the past, enjoyed good relations with the DNR. We would like to foster a continuation of those good relations.

When I was 4 years old I saw a sign advertising Ski Cats. Right away I knew that's what I was going to do. Last year we had to overcome many things to become State Champions. Our sight was sold so we had to find another one. Ski Cats is a very respected and organized group. I can not believe that someone can be that cruel to try to take something away from someone else. Especially someone who has worked so hard for something. Personally I want to show people the things I have worked so hard for 10 years to accomplish. I don't know where I would be if I wasn't in Ski Cats. I would probably be sitting on my butt doing nothing all summer. Everyone works so hard to get our dances perfect, and it is very hard to dance on a small dock with skis on it. Also Aaron Sikowski does a wonderful job with the prop, and how is he going to show it when it wouldn't fit on the dock. Now I will NEVER quit Ski Cats because a neighbor doesn't like me. I am stronger than that, and the whole club is a lot stronger than that. I know we will all pull together just like we did last year. All we want to do is perform for an audience. We mean no harm, and will try our best to not disturb you. I work hard during the off season with homework, volleyball, basketball, and my job. I also live in Crivitz year round while my relatives live farther away. So when they come to visit the first thing they want to do is see a ski show because they know how much effort we put into our skiing. Ski Cats has shown me to respect the feelings of others and to respect them as a whole.

Also Ski Cats has brought me many times of proudness. For example I am the girl on top of the backwards swivel pyramid. Dear Governor Thompson,

We HAVE A BIG Problem! My name is Allison Smith, I'm 14 years old, and I am a member of the Crivitz Ski Cats. We are a water ski club that won 1st place in division 2 at the Wisconsin Water Ski Tournament last year. I saw in the newspaper, Peshtigo Times, an article that you love tourism. The little town of Crivitz in North-east Wisconsin is a big tourist place since we have two waterski clubs, lakes, the Peshtigo River, and many resorts. I am writing to you because last year our ski club had to move sites because the place we were skiing at was sold. The problems began when we moved to our new site at Lake Noquebay Resort. The owners

are great, and are very generous to help us out when we had no where else to go. On the other hand the neighbors do not like us at all. The major problem is that the neighbors complained to the DNR because of all the people that come to see our shows, but there are only 2 shows a week. So in turn we don't get a permit to get a longer dock to put or prop up or do dances on. Also we don't get to have a permit for our jump. I'm sure you haven't seen our ski show, but our show is spectacular. The costumes are great and we have the best props because of Alaron Sikowski.

Last year it got so far that one of the neighbors layed in the lake so our boats couldn't make

a regular boat pattern for the show. Also one of our pickup boats (a boat that picks up skiers that have fallen or if they are hurt) had to stay near him so the boats wouldn't hit ~~at~~ him, and that put skiers at risk for a serious injury. Ski Cats have never been a bad team. We respect others, and are only out there on certain nights or days. The music we play is put on low so it won't disturb others. We clean up all the litter so it looks clean, and Ski Cats have been around for 34 years. The DNR has denied all of our permits. They have no idea what damage they have done. This is our community all year round. I work hard in my school work, I'm in other athletics, and I have a part-time job. So

skiing is my pay off for working so hard during the school year, and I love to ski so much. It has a great reputation with the tourist. You should see how many come over and over again to see our shows! I can even remember one time when we convinced 3 guys to come see our show. (We were selling tickets at the local Piggly Wiggly) They ^{had} never have seen one, and really didn't want to, then that night they decided to come, and after they came up and were amazed by what we did. They said they would tell their friends about it. You should come to see a show sometime, if we have a site! Ski Cats has shown me many things, and I have learned many things about myself in the 10 yrs. I have been in the club. I can remember

When I was this little 4yrs. old shy and scared, but the older skiers helped me a lot. Now that I am older I help younger skiers the same way I was helped. I respect the neighbors opinions, and we have tried to come to an agreement. I even wrote a respectful letter to one of the neighbors, Mr. Andrews. I feel even if I am only 14yrs. old I should have a right to say how I feel since this is effecting a major part of my life. I love to ski, and I have practiced many nights for 10 years with my parents. They have always backed me up 100%. They always want me to live up to my potential, and they never push me to far. So Mr. Tammy Thompson on the behalf of the Crivitz Ski Cats PLEASE help us with

our problems. All we want to do is perform for an audience, and help the tourism in the Crivitz area. PLEASE HELP US!!

In reply to the ski cats on Lake Noquebay, applying for permits, at the Lake Noquebay resort.

I have a cottage which is within 75' of these ski cat shows, along with several other cottage owners.

I oppose, as the others do, the operating of the Ski Cats, in front of our cottages. Our cottage is located on the south shore of Lake Noquebay. In reply to their application for permits to run their ski shows in front of our cottage, and our property, and several others along the shore.

I purchased this property 15 years ago, so we would have a nice place to retire, and really enjoy our retirement. When my wife and I purchased this property, there was a nice supper club next to us, which was about 200' away from our cottage, which we all thought was pretty nice. We could go and have dinner, and a couple drinks, for entertainment, and go back to our cottage where everything was peaceful and quiet.

We put in about \$35,000.00 to improve our cottage, and make things a lot more comfortable for us. We had a beautiful beach-privacy and all the good things, retired people should have.

Our children, and grand children could come up and fish from our dock, plus they could go skiing if they wanted to, or swimming, and really enjoy the cottage. Now it is dangerous for them to do these things. When our children would go skiing, they would go out into the lake far enough, so the engines would not dig up the bottom of the lake. The Ski Cats take off right in front of the cottages, with 350 horse power engines, and dig up the bottom of the lake. You can see the brownfly in the water.

Now our grand-children don't want to come up on weekends, because they cannot fish from our docks. There is no more fish by our docks, due to there (the Ski Cats boats) from stirring up the bottom of the lake, ruining the bottom of the lake and fishing from our docks. They cannot ski cause it is too DANGEROUS- with all these ski Cats and big high powered boats running all over in front of our cottages, all weekend.

These big high powered boats and all the skiing is ruining our fishing, the bottom of the lake and our shorelines. They stirring up the bottom so bad, we ^{are} now getting debris and silt laying on our shores, and in the water.

We purchased our property because of the beauty and the privacy, but this is no longer. These big boats pull up to 16 skiers at a time, and every time they start out they tear up the bottom of the lake, and they come within 20' to 30' from our dock. They make fast turns and cause big waves to wash up to my shore bringing in weeds, snails and bottom silt, covering my nice sand beach and lake bottom.

When they were on the west shore at the Holliday Resort, for about 25 years, the shore was so eroded, from the Ski Cats, that the new owners are at present filling in the lake to restore the shore to its original status.

We have no more privacy. In the middle of the week they have a show on Wednesday night, so they practice tuesday and wednesday before the show. On saturday they have a 6.00p.M. show, so they practice friday and sat. most of the day and on Sundays there is always someone practicing. They have taken our privacy away, plus they are ruining the beauty of the lake.

On show nights, as soon as the Ski show is over then they start giving Kids thrill rides in there big boats and to give the kids the thrill they stand these big boats just about straight up, digging up the bottom of the Lake. Then they race 3 boats abreast, and make fast turns 20' to 30' in front of our docks, causing a big wash and waves a shore..

Wednesday and saturdays: we have 300 to 400 kids and grownups making a lot of noise and some more on Sundays.

You cannot enjoy a weekend with your family with this situation we have here. This is onaly 75' to 100' from my cottage and my neighbor is worse yet. He is rite next to this within 20'. They state they only use there platforms (which are a hazard) and also all the shore water in front of our cottages at least 30 hours a week, and all at the prime times when we as cottage owners and tax payers woud like to use our shores and waters.

These Ski Cats should be at a public beach such as a park and there is one just 1/2 mile west of us, a Marinette county park. We all pay taxes for this park and this is where they should be. It has a big beach, for a crowd of people, to sit and watch a show and they wouldn't disturb anyone there. Also the fire department, and also ambulances would have a major problem coming into these cottages with all the parked cars, which there is not enough room for.

As for there request to change or modify there request for permits for the Ski Cats , I do not agree with them. They state they will stay away from our docks and run 90% of the pulls to the east instead of west, well they promised this at the town meeting in 1996, but they forgot what they said by the time the next show was put on. They say they will turn away from the shore lines as much as possible in all acts. Well they also promised this last year, but it did not happen.

Asfor the jumps at the west end of the lake and staying out 100 yds from the Pines Resort ,I thought the Pines was on the north shore, so I'm confused on theis one.

As for ski jumps on the west shore. They said they they will not be used during weekends until after 3 P.M. They most likley plan on practicing in front of our places on sunday then, like they have in the past.

As for the last paragraph, where they do not harm the lake beauty, fish habitat, water clarity, damage the weed beds and disturbing the bottom of the lake, They do all of these.

If they would look at the article 30-294 in the Wisconsin State Stats they would see they they are doing everything they should not be doing. If we could remind them of what happened to the shore at the Holiday Inn Resort, they would see why we don't want them on our shores.

They compare our boats to theirs (No Way) They say cottage owners disturb the bottom of the lake, They are wrong. There high powered boats are pulling all these skiers 40 to 50 times in an afternoon and when pulling skiers you have to pull full throttle causing boat and motor to tip down and dig into the bottom of the lake. Since we only have 2½ to 3' of water, its to shallow for water skiing and these big boats.

When our kids water ski they go out into deeper water so there motors do not dig up the bottom of the lake. And, when we go out fishing we all idle our motors so they do not touch the bottom of the lake.

They mentioned Ice (fish) shanties as a eye sore to there ski jump. In the winter they might be an eye sore, but they are in no way hurt the lake or damaging anything around the lake.
