P. 286, Item 15

Governor: Delete \$87,000 and one position to reflect the elimination of the birth and developmental outcome monitoring program. Under current law, physicians and nurses must report to DHFS if they confirm or diagnose that an infant or child has a physical condition that results from an adverse neonatal outcome. Under current law, DHFS must develop a system for collecting and disseminating information about adverse neonatal outcomes. The position has been vacant since 1995.

Senator Moen: Birth defects are a serious, costly and many times preventable medical condition. The state should continue to collect and disseminate data about birth defects to increase awareness among pregnant women, establish baseline data for studies and evaluate programs and services.

Motion: Eliminate the 1.0 position, but maintain current law that requires DHFS to collect and disseminate information about adverse neonatal outcomes.
