Moved by Representative Grothman and seconded by Senator Schultz that the JCRAR prepare legislation that would establish a general prohibition on telephone solicitation for the sale of funeral related products and services by funeral directors, cemeterians, insurance agents, sellers of caskets and others.

Moved by Senator Grobschmidt and seconded by Senator Welch that the JCRAR requests that the Funeral Directors Examining Board modify Clearinghouse Rule 96-183 to establish additional requirements relating to live voice telephone solicitation of burial agreement funded with the proceeds of a life insurance policy. The additional requirements are those presented as a proposed modification to the chairpersons of the standing committees in the April 23, 1997 letter from Patricia Reuter, Director of the Bureau of Business and Design Professions. However, the modification should require that written notice to prospective requirements should be sent at least 10 days in advance of a call. The hours during which calls would be allowed should be between the hours of 9 AM and 7 PM. Also, the language in

section FD 6.07(11) relating to complaints about funeral agreements should include the telephone number of the Funeral Directors Examining Board. And, the rule policy allowing live voice telephone solicitation should have a sunset date of January 1, 2000.

If the Board does not inform the JCRAR of its agreement to modify by 5 PM, Wednesday, July 2, 1997, the JCRAR concurs in the objection of the Senate Committee on Economic Development, Housing and Government Operations.
