Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law limits the increase in the total amount of revenue that a school district may receive from general school aids and property taxes. ~~In each school year, the maximum allowable increase per pupil is \$206.~~ The limit is based on the difference between the average of the number of pupils enrolled in the ~~3~~ ^{three} previous school years and the average of the number of pupils enrolled in the current and ~~2~~ ^{two} preceding school years.

This bill increases the school district's revenue limit in any school year by the amount spent by the school district in the previous school year for special assessments for public improvements.
