Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate							
AB 9 would grant creditable WRS service for volunteer service in the Peace Corps, VISTA or any national service program based on the same eligibility criteria as currently exists for military service credit.							
The initial costs of implementation of the bill for our department would be for staff training, developing and updating informational materials including revising the department's toll-free telephone message system (TMS) and developing procedures for review of qualifying volunteer service. The hours and costs are the following: 20 hours for forms/brochure content development; 6 hours for TMS revision and recording; 500 hours to respond to inquiries (1,000 inquiries x .50 hr/inquiry) for information on the new provision; 10 hours to develop procedures to determine volunteer service eligibility and qualification; and 60 hours for supervisor and staff training. One-time salary and fringe costs associated with the 596 hours is \$10,600.							
One-time costs associated with designing the application and brochure and printing and mailing the forms to both inquiries and our 1200 employers plus the additional hours necessary to prep, scan and index the new participant forms to our imaging system would be approximately \$1,400.							
The bill also requires our Controller's Office to update the unfunded liability balance of employers, calculate the new prior service contribution rates and update those rates on our Wisconsin Employe Benefit System (WEBS). We estimate approximately 50 participants per year will receive creditable service under the bill requiring additional workload and costs of \$290.75 per year (50 participants x .25 hour/participant x \$23.26/hr salary and fringe).							
In addition, our Division of Employer Services must key, process and audit all volunteer service applications. Estimating approximately 50 participants per year will receive creditable service, this results in on-going costs of \$1053 per year (52 hours x \$20.25/hr salary and fringe). One-time costs to revise the WRS employer administration manual and to create an employer bulletin to all employers notifying them of the new provision and its procedures will cost \$157 (8 hours x \$19.70/hr salary and fringe).
