This bill requires that a privacy impact statement be prepared on any proposed bill that would have an impact on personal privacy under certain specified conditions. The statement must describe the impact on personal privacy and analyze the desirability of that impact from the standpoint of public policy.						
The Department of Commerce administers over 60 credentialing programs. It also administers a range of regulatory functions, in addition to a variety of grant and loan programs. In the administration of these programs and functions, the Department requires information from individuals. The total annual amount of time involved in preparing privacy impact statements will depend on the number and types of bills that are introduced which may require the Department to request additional personally identifiable information, may be interpreted as an activity which constitutes an intrusion on the privacy of an individual, or may permit or cause publicity to be given to the private life of an individual. It is not possible to estimate the number of bills that may be introduced which will meet the conditions specified in this legislation, and thus, require the preparation of privacy impact statements. Therefore, it is difficult to estimate the total impact on the agency, and on the Department's ability to absorb any additional costs with existing staff and resources.
