

1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 27

January 14, 1999 – Introduced by Representatives SCHNEIDER, J. LEHMAN, MUSSER and BERCEAU. Referred to Committee on Insurance.

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 631.31 (1) (a), 631.31 (1) (b), 631.31 (1) (c) and 631.31 (1) (d);
2 and *to create* 631.31 (1) (f) of the statutes; **relating to:** providing information
3 in an insurance policy about policy cancellation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law requires a number of types of information to appear on the first page of an insurance policy, such as the corporate name of the insurer and the insured's right to return a health insurance policy within ten days of receipt. This bill requires that the grounds upon which the policy may be canceled also appear on the first page of the policy.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
