

1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 28

January 14, 1999 – Introduced by Representatives SCHNEIDER, BOYLE, WALKER, MEYER, GRONEMUS, KREUSER, BERCEAU and LASSA, cosponsored by Senators SCHULTZ and GEORGE. Referred to Committee on Judiciary and Personal Privacy.

1 AN ACT *to renumber* 36.11 (35) (title); *to renumber and amend* 36.11 (35); and
2 *to create* 36.32 (1) of the statutes; **relating to:** the use of a person’s social
3 security number in his or her student identification number at private
4 institutions of higher education.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, beginning January 1, 2000, the University of Wisconsin System, a technical college district board, a school board and the governing body of a private school are prohibited from assigning to any student an identification number that is identical to or incorporates the student’s social security number.

Beginning January 1, 2002, this bill extends this prohibition to private institutions of higher education located in this state.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
