Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, beginning in the 2002–03 school year a school board may not promote a fourth grade pupil to the fifth grade, or an eighth grade pupil to the ninth grade, unless the pupil passes a statewide examination or an examination developed or approved by the school board. A school board must excuse the pupil from the examination if the pupil's parent or guardian so requests. The school board must develop alternative criteria for promoting a pupil who does not take the examination.

This bill eliminates all of the above provisions. The bill directs each school board to adopt a written policy specifying the criteria for promoting a pupil from the fourth-to the fifth grade and from the eighth to the ninth grade. The criteria must include the pupil's score on the fourth or eighth grade examination, the pupil's academic performance, and the recommendations of teachers. Beginning in the 2002–03 school year, the bill provides that a school board may not promote a fourth grade pupil to the fifth grade, or an eighth grade pupil to the ninth grade, unless the pupil satisfies the criteria specified in the school board's policy.


