

### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law provides that a person may sell or promote the sale of goods and services on school district property unless the school board adopts written resolutions that prohibit, restrict or otherwise regulate the sale or promotion of goods and services.

This bill prohibits a school board from selling advertising space on any school y radio or television broadcast or in any school facility, school bus, school electronic mail system or school publication, except for newspapers, yearbooks or programs for school athletic events.







(1) This act first applies to contracts entered into, modified, extended or renewed on the effective date of this subsection.

The bill also prohibits a school board from entering into a contract for telecommunications goods and services that requires the dissemination of advertising to pupils or that provides telecommunications goods and services at a price below market value with the expectation that the goods and services will be used to disseminate advertising to pupils:
