This bill provides that a person arrested and taken into custody for certain felony offenses against children may not be							
released until a court has established conditions of release for the person. The bill continues to require that the							
person must be taken within a reasonable time before a judge in the county in which the offense was alleged to have							
been committed. The felony offenses against children covered by the bill are sexual contact or sexual intercourse							
with a child, physical abuse of a child, abandonment of a child and neglecting a child.							
The Department of Corrections (DOC) does not anticipate any state fiscal impact from this legislation.							
Although county jails anticipate that there may be some increase in jail populations as a result of this legislation, they							
are unable to estimate how much.
