This bill provides that a person arrested and taken into custody for certain felony offenses against children may not be released until a court has established conditions of release for the person. In other words, such a person may not post bail upon arrest. Rather, the person will be held in custody until he or she appears before the judge.  In the State Public Defender's Office's experience, persons who are arrested for the crimes specified in the bill and represented by the SPD generally do not currently post bail upon arrest for the crimes specified in the bill. Therefore, the SPD does not expect to incur any costs if this bill is passed.
