Any local governmental unit that currently has a residency requirement in effect may see a reduction in costs. The cost savings will be due to elimination of costs incurred for verifying and monitoring the residence of certain employees, other than emergency personnel. Conversely, municipalities without a current residency requirement may see an increase in costs due to staff having to verify and monitor the residence of police officers and firefighters. These costs are likely to be minimal on an individual government basis and are likely to be absorbed within existing resources. In addition, the amount of staff time required for these activities varies, according to the number of employees that have to be monitored. Therefore, the cost savings or increase will vary extensively among units of government.

It is not possible to estimate the value of the cost savings or the increased costs associated with this bill. Therefore, the fiscal effect of this bill is indeterminable.
