



As we discussed briefly, Steve from Rep. Black's office called regarding a request to increase the Wisconsin Higher Education Grant (WHEG) appropriation under s.20.235 (1) (fe) by the rate of the highest tuition increase (undergraduate, resident tuition) at a UW-System campus. I told both Steve and Merry Larson (6-5996, Fiscal Bureau) that either the appropriation could be changed from a sum certain to a sum sufficient and the board could be directed to award higher grants to those students who experienced the higher tuition increases or they could increase the appropriation and similarly direct the board. However, Black's office does not want to restrict the board.

According to Merry, there is something called a "capped" sum sufficient appropriation. I wasn't sure what that was, and neither was she, but she is going to speak to Dave Loppnow, her team leader, and then call you to explain how this would work. I called Steve to let him know where things stood and that you would be the drafter. I haven't entered the request because I'm still not sure exactly what they want or whether this capped sum sufficient is feasible. So, Merry should be calling you sometime within the next week. Please call Steve back when you have a handle on this to let him know what you think.
