**Affected Ch. 20 Appropriations**

**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:**

This bill provides that a pupil may not enroll in an institution of higher education or a technical college to take a course for high school credit under the youth options program if the pupil has been suspended or has repeated a grade or if the pupil has the credits necessary to graduate from high school. The bill also provides that if a pupil enrolls in an institution of higher education or a technical college for high school credit under the program and fails to complete the course or receives a grade of failure or unsatisfactory in the course, the pupil, or if the pupil is a minor, the pupil's parents, must reimburse the school board for the cost of the course. If the parents or pupil fail to reimburse the school board, the board may file a court action against the pupil or parents for reimbursement.

**State Fiscal Effect**

There is no state fiscal impact for the department of public instruction. Institutions of higher education or technical colleges may have decreases in revenue if some pupils are excluded from the youth options program. DPI does not collect data from school districts that would indicate how many pupils might be excluded.

**Local Fiscal Effect**

This bill may decrease local costs if certain pupils are excluded from the program. Districts would not have to pay tuition for those students. DPI does not collect data from school districts that would indicate how many pupils might be excluded or how much costs might be reduced.
