Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the state superintendent of public instruction must conduct, a background investigation of each applicant for issuance or renewal of a license or permit issued by the state superintendent.

Under this bill, before hiring a person who does not hold a license or permit ssued by the state superintendent, a school district or charter school must request the state superintendent to conduct a background investigation of the person. The tate superintendent must conduct the investigation and disclose the results to the school district or charter school that made the request. The bill also directs the state superintendent, before hiring a person who does not hold a license or permit issued by the state superintendent to work at the Wisconsin School for the Visually Handicapped or the Wisconsin School for the Deaf, to conduct a background investigation of the person.


