Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate						
Assembly Bill 244 would create an income tax and franchise tax credit for businesses that pay tuition for an individual to participate in a degree-granting program at any UW System institution, technical college institution or regionally accredited 4-year nonprofit college or university having its regional headquarters and principal place of business in the state. Under the bill, a business could claim as a credit 50% of tuition that the business paid for an individual to participate in an associate, bachelor's or graduate degree program at an eligible institution. The bill would have no immediate fiscal impact on UW System. However, the bill would provide an increased incentive for businesses to pay for individuals to obtain a degree, and as a result would likely result in an increased demand for degree-granting programs.
