Current federal law authorizes the sale of forest products produced on land owned or leased by a federal military department. The state's share must be used to benefit the public schools and public roads of the county in which the military installation or facility is situated.

Recently, the state received approximately \$68,000 under the federal law described above as a result of logging at Fort McCoy in Monroe County. This bill appropriates the moneys to the department of administration (DOA). The bill directs DOA to distribute 50% of the amount received to the school districts located in Monroe County and the other 50% to Monroe County for the benefit of the public roads in Monroe County.
