Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate							
(1) the intent is that the blood, semen, urine, or feces should come into contact with the person, (2) the intent is to either cause bodily harm to the person or to abuse, harass, offend, intimidate, or frighten that person, and (3) the officer, employee, visitor, or other prisoner has not consented.  This bill also allows a court to order a prisoner charged with throwing or expelling blood, semen, urine, or feces to undergo tests for the presence of communicable diseases. The prosecutor may apply to the court for such a test at the victim's request or if there is probable cause that the assault carried a potential for transmitting a communicable disease to the victim. The communicable diseases for which tests may be ordered under the bill include HIV, sexually transmitted diseases, hepatitis B and hepatitis C.  The State Laboratory of Hygiene would carry out these tests. The list below shows the most relevant tests and their associated prices.
