This bill requires a court to sentence an offender convicted of certain sex offenses to at least a one-year prison sentence. Assuming that this bill becomes law after truth-in-sentencing becomes effective on 12/31/99, offenders will have to serve at least one year in a state prison for conviction of one of the enumerated offenses. In calendar year 1998, 507 offenders were sentenced to a state prison for one of the crimes listed in this bill. Under current law, anyone sentenced to a state prison must have a minimum 1-year sentence. Thus, it is assumed that SB 82 will not affect offenders who would have been sentenced to prison without this law. In calendar year 1998, 508 offenders were placed on probation for one of the crimes listed in the bill. Assuming this data is representative of future statistics, approximately 508 offenders a year would have to be sentenced to a state prison, who would otherwise have been placed on probation. Assuming that each inmate must serve at least one year, there will be a 508 increase in the prison population. Since our prisons are presently over capacity, one option to house this increase would be the construction of one new 525-bed medium security correctional institution. Construction costs are estimated at \$38,700,000. The funding for construction projects is usually obtained through general obligation bonding. Repayment of bonds would be spread over a period of 20 years and the loan repayment cost would be greater than the construction cost. Annual operating costs are estimated at \$14,432,800 and 295 staff would be required. One-time costs are \$1,162,100. A second option would be the transfer of 508 additional inmates to out-of-state prisons. Assuming a daily rate of \$42, the annual cost is estimated at \$7,787,600.
