AN ACT to amend 343.43 (1) (f) of the statutes; relating to: duplicating a motor

2 vehicle operating license.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law prohibits any person from duplicating, by any means whatever, a driver's license. Penalties for a violation range from a mandatory minimum forfeiture of \$200 for a first offense, up to a maximum penalty of a \$2,000 fine and imprisonment for six months for a third or subsequent offense within three years.

This bill creates an exception to this prohibition. The bill allows a person to reproduce a copy of a driver's license if the reproduction is done according to rules promulgated by the department of transportation and for a valid business or occupational purpose.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 343.43 (1) (f) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 4 343.43 (1) (f) Reproduce by any means whatever a copy of a license, unless the
- 5 reproduction is done pursuant to rules promulgated by the department and for a
