Dear Mr. Weller:

Your request for the story behind the present delayed bass season opener regulation has been difficult to find out. Here is what I've been able to come up with.

I can't come up with an exact date this fish rule change went into effect but it had to have been about 10 years ago. What happened was a state assemblyman promised a friend of his, who was on his death bed, that he would do everything in his power to change the bass season opener to a later date. This assemblyman then put pressure on a couple of his Natural Resources Board Member friends (both of which no longer serve on the board), who in turn pressured Jim Addis, fish management chief at the time, to change (delay) the bass season opener regulation. The Fish Management Bureau Chief then pressured the Fish Management Inland Management Section Chief to implement this regulation change. This was of course carried out and did pass the state wide conservation congress vote and was quickly enacted into law.

I would urge you to be sure and talk to your local fish manager, Larry Damman, and get his biological assessment (need) for this regulation before you write your letter. I would suggest that you address your letter to the present Chief of Fisheries, Lee Kernan, with a carbon copy to the present Natural Resources Board Chairman, Herb Behnke, and Vice Chairman, Trygve Solberg. I have included all of their mailing addresses as per your request. If I can be of further help to you, please let me know.

(1) The open seasons specified in the following table apply to fishing in open waters and fishing through the ice. The department may, following scientific investigation and study, establish bag limits and size limits on the individual inland waters when it finds that the taking of fish will aid in management of the fishery and insure the citizens of this state additional opportunities for good fishing. Such special regulations shall become effective only after public informational meetings are held. The department may also establish an urban fishing program by posting the open and closed seasons on specified waters. For open seasons in specified waters see s. NR 20.04. - (2) Any fish taken and retained in possession that is not released freely into the water immediately after capture shall be considered part of the angler's daily bag limit.
- (3) No person may take fish by snagging or foul hooking unless authorized by s. NR 20.04 (3) (d) 2. f.
  - (4) No person may fish for fish of any variety during the

closed season for trout in the Brule river upstream from the rail-road bridge in section 29, township 42 north, range 34 west. Iron county, Michigan and section 25, township 41 north, range 15 east, Florence county, Wisconsin and in the Montreal river above the Saxon Falls flowage.

NR 23.055 Modifications in daily bag limit and minimum size limit in response to tribal harvest. (1) ADJUST-MENT. In order to prevent a total harvest of more than 35% of the adult walleye population or 27% of the adult muskellunge population, the secretary may lower the daily bag limit on walleye and increase the minimum size limit for muskellunge in specific waters in response to the harvest goals of the Chippewa bands for

their spear, net or trapfisheries. The adjusted daily bag and size limits shall be in effect until March 1 of the year following the tribal harvest. The safe harvest levels on individual waters shall be determined by the department.

(a) Walleyes. The daily bag limit will be reduced when the department is notified by the Chippewa bands of their harvest goals on individual waters. The extent of the reduction depends upon the percent of the safe harvest they intend to take and the age of the population estimate used to determine the safe harvest or if a regression model was used to determine the safe harvest. The daily bag limits to be used with the different percentages and for various basis of determining the safe harvest are as follows:

Under current law, the department of natural resource (DNR) may establish different fishing seasons for different types of fish, and the seasons may vary throughout the state. Under this bill any fishing season established for bass must be the same throughout the state.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 29.014 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.014 (1) The department shall establish and maintain open and closed seasons for fish and game, subject to sub. (1m), and any bag limits, size limits, rest days and other conditions governing the taking of fish and game that will conserve the fish and game supply and ensure the citizens of this state continued opportunities for good fishing, hunting and trapping.
