## 1999 ASSE MBLY BILL 350

May 17, 1999 - Introduced by Representatives Stone, Plale, Montgomery, Urban, Kelso, Albers and Wasserman, cosponsored by Senator Roessler. Referred to Committee on State Affairs.

An ACT to create 125.04 (5) (a) 6 . of the statutes; relating to: qualifications for possessing a license or permit to sell or serve al cohol beverages.

## Anal ysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, no license or permit relating to the production, distribution, sale or serving of al cohol beverages may be issued to a person who does not meet the minimum qualifications. With exceptions for specific licenses or permits, the minimum qualifications include not having an arrest or conviction record, being a resident of this state, having attained the legal drinking age and completing an approved responsible beverage server training course. Current law also prohibits the issuance of a license or permit relating to alcohol beverages to any person who is a habitual law offender or who has been convicted of a felony, unless pardoned.

This bill prohibits the issuance of a license or permit relating to alcohol beverages to any person who has been convicted of three or more offenses related to operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or other intoxicant (OWI), or improperly refusing to submit to a chemical test of the person's blood, breath or urine after being placed under arrest for OWI, if at least one of the offenses is committed after this bill takes effect.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

125.04 (5) (a) 6 . Have not been convicted of 3 or more offenses that may be counted under s. 343.307 (2), at least one of which offense was committed on or after the effective date of this subdivision .... [revisor inserts date].
