AB 362's requirement that insurance policies cover contraceptive articles and services will have no fiscal impact on the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission.


The additional cost of covering such articles/services will increase local government costs but the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission has no basis for making an informed estimate as to the level of that increase.
