Revise 100.297 (2) except as provided in sub. (3), no person may sell or offer for sale at retail any product in a plastic container unless the plastic container consists of at least 10% post consumer recycled material as defined in s. 287.01(7) by weight by January 1, 2001, 20% post consumer recycled material by weight by January 1, 2003, and 25% post consumer recycled material by weight by January 1, 2005.

- (3) Subsection (2) does not apply to containers that are regulated under the federal food, drug and cosmetic act 21USC 301-394 and for which the federal food and drug administration has prohibited the use of recycled material in such containers.
- (4) Any person who violates sub (2) shall be required to forfeit no more than \$200 for each violation.

AN ACT ./.; relating to: prohibiting the sale of a product in a plastic container if

the container does not consist of a percentage of post consumer recycled

material by weight and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person, except under certain circumstances, may only sell a product in a plastic container if the container consists of at least 10% recycled or remanufactured material by weight. This requirement applies to the sale of food, beverages, drugs, cosmetics or medical devices that are regulated under the federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act only if the federal food and drug administration approves the use of a plastic container that consists of at least 10% or more recycled or remanufactured material to sell the food, beverage, drug, cosmetic or medical device.

This bill prohibits the sale except in certain circumstances, of a product in a plastic container unless the container consists of at least 10% post consumer recycled material by weight beginning on January 1, 2001, at least 20% post consumer recycled material by weight beginning on January 1, 2003, and at least 25% post consumer recycled material by weight beginning on January 1, 2005. Post consumer recycled material by weight beginning on January 1, 2005. Post consumer recycled material is solid waste other than solid waste generated in the production of goods, hazardous waste, waste from the construction and demolition of structures, scrap automobiles or high—volume industrial waste. The prohibition does not apply to the sale of food, beverages, drugs, cosmetics or medical devices that are regulated by the federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act if the federal food and drug

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administration prohibits the sale of the product in a plastic container that consists of the specified percentage of post consumer recycled material by weight. A person who sells a product in a plastic container that does not contain the required percentage of post consumer recycled material by weight is subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$200.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
