February 3, 1998 - Introduced by Representatives MUSSER, ZUKOWSKI, OWENS, TURNER, VANDER LOOP, AINSWORTH, HAHN, PLOUFF, KREUSER and RILEY. Referred to Committee on Government Operations.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 45.49 (1) and 230.35 (4) (a) 3.; and **to create** 45.49 (1m) and
2 230.35 (4) (a) 11. of the statutes; **relating to:** state government holidays.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, all offices of the agencies of state government are closed on Saturdays, Sundays and a total of 9 state holidays. Among these holidays is the last Monday in May, which is used as the day of celebration for May 30. (This day is traditionally used to celebrate and observe Memorial Day.) This bill provides that May 30 must be the day on which the offices of the agencies of state government are closed to celebrate and observe Memorial Day, unless May 30 falls on a Saturday or Sunday. If May 30 falls on a Saturday or Sunday, then the following Monday is the day on which the offices of the agencies of state government are closed.

For further information see the *state* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.
