

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

MANUAR Current law with certain exceptions, protailer, manufacturer on distributor of cigarettes or tobacco products (cigarettes) france protected or tobacco products cigarettes to any person under the age of 18. A court may require a person who violates this prohibition to forfeit up to \$500, and may suspend the violator's license or permit to manufacture, sell of Market cigarettes (license or permit) for a period of up to 30 days. Current law increases the minimum forfeiture, and the minimum and maximum duration of a license or permit suspension, based upon the number of violations committed within the previous 12 months.

This bill eliminates the time period for counting previous violations and changes the penalties that apply. Under the bill, the penalties for violations are as follows:

1) For a first violation, a mandatory forfeiture of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000. - second

2) For a 2004 violation, a mandatory forfeiture of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$2,000. In addition, the court must suspend the violator's license or permit for not less than 30 days nor more than 90 days.
