The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL PREFATORY NOTE: This draft was prepared for the joint legislative council's special committee on capture of federal resources.

Federal Resources Website

The draft requires the department of administration (DOA) to create and maintain a website on the internet to provide information on the availability of federal grants, procurement and service contracts, financial assistance, matching funds and other federal resources to statewide and local industry, business and trade associations, local units of government, school districts and other educational institutions, private businesses, nonprofit organizations, procurement assistance organizations and other interested persons.

In addition, the website shall: (1) serve as a statewide clearinghouse to obtain and exchange information on available federal funding and other resources; (2) increase public awareness of opportunities for contracts with the federal government and organizations in Wisconsin that can assist in facilitating such contracts; and (3) inform interested parties about organizations, programs and courses in Wisconsin that offer training and assistance in applying for federal funding and in grant writing skills.

Under the draft, the department shall encourage the private sector, through statewide and local associations, to promote and publicize the website's existence.

Finally, the draft provides that a newly created council on capture of federal resources, described below, shall advise the department on the content and operation of the website.

State Assistance to School Districts

This draft requires the state superintendent of public instruction to provide assistance at the cooperative educational service agency (CESA) district level to school districts in identifying federal grants for which the school districts may be eligible and in applying for those grants, including the provision of training in grant writing.

The draft creates a 9-member council on capture of federal resources, which would include representatives of the department of public instruction, the University of Wisconsin (UW)-Extension, business, nonprofit organizations, municipalities, school districts and procurement assistance organizations. The council would be required to advise the state superintendent of public instruction regarding his or her duties under the draft.

Finally, the draft requires the legislative audit bureau to prepare periodic reports on compliance by the state superintendent with his or her duties under the draft, which shall be filed with the legislature, the governor and DOA.

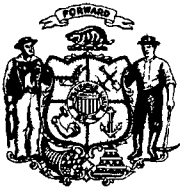

AN ACT to create 13.94 (1) (q), 15.107 (13), 16.25, 16.26 and 115.28 (42) of the statutes; relating to: the establishment of a federal resources Web site by the department of administration, state assistance to school districts and local law enforcement agencies in capturing federal resources and creating a council on capture of federal resources.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill is explained in the NOTE provided by the joint legislative council. For further information see the *state* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

PREFATORY NOTE: This bill was prepared for the joint legislative council's special committee on capture of federal resources.

Federal Resources Web Site

The bill requires the department of administration (DOA) to create and maintain a Web site on the Internet to provide information on the availability of federal grants, procurement and service contracts, financial assistance, matching funds and other federal resources to statewide and local industry, business and trade associations, local units of government, school districts and other educational institutions, private businesses, nonprofit organizations, procurement assistance organizations and other interested persons.

BILL

In addition, the bill provides that the Web site shall: 1) serve as a statewide clearinghouse to obtain and exchange information on available federal funding and other resources; 2) increase public awareness of opportunities for contracts with the federal government and organizations in Wisconsin that can assist in facilitating such contracts; and 3) inform interested parties about organizations, programs and courses in Wisconsin that offer training and assistance in applying for federal funding and in grant writing skills.

Under the bill, DOA must encourage the private sector, through statewide and local associations, to promote and publicize the Web site's existence.

Finally, the bill provides that a newly created council on capture of federal resources, described below, shall advise the department on the content and operation of the Web site.

State Assistance to School Districts and Local Law Enforcement Agencies

This bill requires the state superintendent of public instruction to provide assistance at the cooperative educational service agency (CESA) district level to school districts in identifying federal grants for which the school districts may be eligible and in applying for those grants, including the provision of training in grant writing. [CESAs are regional governmental units that provide services to school districts.]

The bill also requires the attorney general to provide such assistance to local law enforcement agencies.

The bill creates a council on capture of federal resources consisting of 9 members appointed by the governor to serve for staggered three-year terms. The membership includes representatives of the department of public instruction, the University of Wisconsin (UW)-Extension, private businesses, nonprofit organizations, municipalities, school districts and procurement assistance organizations. The council is required to advise the state superintendent of public instruction regarding his or her duties under the bill.

Finally, the bill requires the legislative audit bureau to prepare periodic reports on compliance by the state superintendent with his or her duties under the bill.
