In this substitute we would like you to create a new board for the licensing of psychotherapy. Use the structure of the licensure section of the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Examining Board as describe in AB 420.

supercede

Drop all changes to the S W, MFT & PC Examining Board described in AB 420, keeping as it now stands in the Statutes.

This new board will license professionals to practice psychotherapy as their particular profession, that is licensed to practice psychotherapy as a Clinical Social Worker, as a Clinical Marriage and Family Therapist, as a Clinical Professional Counselor.

Other professions should be able to be licensed as psychotherapy if they meet a national standard of education require to practice psychotherapy at the maters level or greater.


The members of this new board would be the same as in the licensure section in AB 420 but the membership should be able to expand to include other professions represented as they meet the standards of education to practice psychotherapy.

Psychometric testing can be practice if the individual seeking to administer a test meets the standards set by the American Psychologist Association.


Those seeking to be licensed must have two years/3,000 hours of supervised clinical practice under the supervision of an individual who is a licensed psychotherapist in the field they are specializing and has a doctorate degree in that field or a masters degree with five years experience or where this is not possible any licensed psychotherapist (psychologist/psychiatrist.).

AN ACT ...; relating to: regulating the practice of psychotherapy, creating a psychotherapy examining board, granting rule-making authority and providing a penalty.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 15.08 (1m) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

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

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
