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Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill makes a number of changes regarding divorce and paternity actions. These actions could reduce the amount of child support collections retained by the state in cases where support is assigned to the state. Locally, the bill could result in an increase in the workload of child support agencies due to the need to provide additional services to IV-D recipients. The fiscal effects of these impacts is indeterminable.

Eliminating the provision in current law that grants sole legal custody to mothers in a paternity action unless the court orders otherwise may decrease cooperation of unmarried mothers with efforts to establish paternity. The state's eligibility for federal performance based funding is contingent upon the number of paternities established within a specified period of time after a child's birth. Any decrease in paternity establishments or delay in paternity establishment procedures will reduce federal performance based funding the state currently receives.

Modifications to custody and physical placement orders allowed under the bill would likely result in a significant number of requests for revision to current orders for physical placement, which then could lead to requests for modifications to the child support under the guidelines for shared time. Processing these requests would increase costs to the child support system at the local level.

The provision that changes the liability of adjudicated fathers for past support to the date the action is commenced could delay the adjudication process in certain cases. Any delay would result in less child support collected by the state to offset public assistance costs or the amounts passed through to custodial parents.

The provision requiring the court to make temporary orders assigning custody and physical placement of the child in paternity actions will involve county child support agencies in handling issues for which no federal reimbursement is available. Currently the state is reimbursed by the federal government for 66% of eligible child support costs.
