Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate This bill extends the time period for filing family and medical leave cases with the Equal Rights Division of the department from 30 to 300 days. Over the past four years, the division received an average of 160 cases per year under this law. Passage of this bill may cause a small increase of about 10% in caseload but not significant enough to require increased staff, since an Equal Rights Officer is expected to complete 132 cases per year. Informational brochures on the law that are published by the Equal Rights Division will need to be reprinted at an estimated cost of \$1,000 (GPR funded). This cost will be absorbed within the Equal Rights Division's budget.		
The bill also creates an appeal to the Labor Industry Review Commission (LIRC), that does not now exist. It is estimated that up to 10 new cases per year may be appealed to LIRC if this bill is passed. The overall increase in workload is not considered to be a significant increase. Therefore, it is anticipated that the additional cost to process up to 10 new cases/year could be absorbed within LIRC's current budget authority.		
While this bill is unlikely to have a significant impact on local government costs, it is possible that local governments and school districts may see a small increase in the number of cases filed, due to the extension of the time limit for the filing of a complaint. However, because of the small number of Family and Medical Leave cases filed each year, it is not likely that there will be a significant growth in cases that can be attributable to the increase in the time limit.
