Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

This bill requires an employee of a school district, a charter school or a private school who has reason to believe that a person possesses a dangerous weapon while at school or under the supervision of school authorities to notify immediately the school principal, or his or her designee, who must then notify immediately a local law enforcement agency. A person who in good faith provides either kind of notification and his or her employer are immune from civil liability for the act of notification. This bill provides an exception from the notification requirement if a person is possessing or using a firearm or bow as part of a hunter education or bow hunter education program or is using a tool to fulfill a requirement of a class.

This bill has no fiscal effect.


