(b) and initial recommendations for budget proposals and legislation under par. (c) no later than July 1, 2000. Upon establishing benchmarks under par. - 1. Notify counties by April 1, 2000 of the opportunity to apply for a prevention planning grant under this subsection.
- 2. Develop and distribute by July 1, 2000 a request for proposals from counties, other political subdivisions and nonprofit agencies to apply for a prevention planning grant. The request for proposals shall require the applicant to specify the county or multi-county area, or another area approved by the department and the department of public instruction, to which a prevention plan developed under sub. (4) (b) will apply. Applications for prevention planning grants shall be submitted to the department by November 1, 2000. In the 1999-01 state fiscal biennium, no more than 4 applicants from rural areas and 4 applicants from urban areas may be selected to receive prevention planning grants.
- 3. Annually, evaluate and report to the council created in s. 15.197 (3) on the progress of recipients of prevention planning grants under par. 

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DRAFTER'S NOTE FROM THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU

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Anne and Pam:

In addition to numerous minor changes made for sake of clarity and consistency, this draft makes the following larger changes to WLCS-0044/3:

- 1. In s. 15.197 (3) (a) (intro.), it is the practice of the LRB not to cross-reference the duties of a body created in ch. 15.
- 2. In s. 15.197(3)(a) 6. to 9., the preferred method of appointing legislative members of a council is to say that they are appointed "as are members of . . . standing committees". That way those members are appointed as near to the commencement of the session as possible (see SR 20 and AR 9) and hold their appointment until the 1st Monday in January of the next odd—numbered year (see s. 13.45 (1) (a)
- 3. In s. 15.197 (3) (a) 14., although the term "public member" is often found in ch. 15, that term is not defined in the statutes, so its use is discouraged. Instead the attributes of the member should be described, which s. 15.197 (3) (a) 14. does.
- 4. In s. 15.197 (3) (b), the preferred method of providing for staggered terms is to stagger the expiration of the members' initial appointments in a nonstatutory provision. To provide for staggered terms in the statutes might be construed to imply ongoing authority to stagger terms. Accordingly, this draft staggers the initial terms of the appointed members, other than the legislative members, in a nonstatutory provision. The draft also specifies more precisely which appointed members shall be appointed for 3-year terms. In addition, the draft says that the members "shall be appointed" rather than "shall serve" because "shall serve" can be construed to mean that they cannot die or resign during their term.
- 5. In s. 46.505 (2) (d) and (3) (a) 5.7 this draft specified more precisely the federal restrictions that the prevention coordination council and DHFS may seek to have waived. For a statutory example of this type of language, see. s. 106.115 (2) (d).

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

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

PREFATORY NOTE: This bill was prepared for the joint legislative council's special committee on programs for prevention services. The bill creates a prevention coordination council in the department of health and family services (DHFS). The bill also creates a pilot prevention planning grant program for counties, other political subdivisions and nonprofit agencies, to be administered by DHFS with assistance from the department of public instruction (DPI).

More detailed descriptions of the provisions of the bill are contained in the NOTES following each SECTION of the bill.

SECTION 1. 15.197 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

(b) and the initial recommendations for state budget proposals and proposed legislation developed under par. (c) by no later than July 1, 2000. Upon establishing benchmarks under par. (h), adopting any change to the statewide goals or benchmarks or developing any additional recommendations for state budget proposals or proposed legislation, the prevention coordination council shall prepare a report summarizing the benchmarks, changes a recommendation of submission to the governor, the secretary, the superintendent of public instruction and the chief clerk of each house of the legislature, for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under s. 13.172 (3).
- (h) Establish benchmarks that set forth the expected level of progress of prevention services toward meeting the statewide goals developed under par. (b), when sufficient data are available on the appropriateness of the measures identified under par. (b) for measuring the progress of prevention services toward meeting those goals.

- (3) PREVENTION PLANNING. (a) *Duties of departments*. The department of health and family services, with the assistance of the department of public instruction, shall do all of the following:
- 1. Notify counties by April 1, 2000, of the opportunity to apply for a prevention planning grant under this subsection.
- 2. Develop and distribute by July 1, 2000, a request for proposals from counties, other political subdivisions and nonprofit agencies to apply for a prevention planning grant. The request for proposals shall require the applicant to specify the county or multicounty area, or another area approved by the department of health and family services and the department of public instruction, to which a prevention plan developed under sub. (4) (b) will apply. Applications for prevention planning grants shall be submitted to the department of health and family services by November 1, 2000. In the 1999-2001 state fiscal biennium, no more than 4 applicants from rural areas and 4 applicants from urban areas may be selected to receive prevention planning grants.
- 3. Annually, evaluate and report to the prevention coordination council on the progress of recipients of prevention planning grants under par. (b) in developing and implementing prevention plans, developing uniform systems of data collection and establishing systems for evaluating prevention services in the areas specified by those recipients under subd. 2.
- 4. Serve as or identify another entity to serve as a state clearinghouse to make available information about prevention programs and approaches that have been proven to be effective and information about methods for evaluating prevention programs.

- 5. Determine whether the waiver of any federal funding restriction or other restriction under federal law or regulation is necessary for the implementation of the prevention planning grant under this subsection and subs. (4) to (6) and, if so, seek a waiver of that restriction.
- (b) Administration of grants. From the appropriation under s. 20.435 (3) (fr), the department of health and family services, beginning on January 1, 2001, shall, with assistance from the department of public instruction, provide 2-year prevention planning grants for the purposes specified in sub. (4).
- (c) Staff. The secretary and the superintendent of public instruction each shall designate a staff person to carry out the duties under this subsection.
- (4) Purpose and use of grant funds. The purpose of a grant awarded under sub. (3) (b) is to develop and implement a plan for the coordination of local prevention services and funding in the area specified by the applicant under sub. (3) (a) 2., develop a uniform system of data collection among providers of prevention services in that area and establish a system for evaluating prevention services in that area. The grants awarded under this section shall be used for all of the following purposes:
- (a) To establish and maintain the local prevention consortium under sub. (5)(a), including the cost of the designated staff person under sub. (5) (b).
- (b) To pay expenses incurred in the development and implementation of a prevention plan for the area specified by the applicant under sub. (3) (a) 2. under which comprehensive prevention services are provided in the area using the available prevention resources in the area.
- (c) To pay expenses incurred in developing a uniform system of data collection by the county or counties, other appropriate political subdivisions and prevention service providers in the area specified by the applicant under sub. (3) (a) 2.

1	(d) To pay expenses incurred in developing a system for evaluating prevention
2	services in the area specified by the applicant under sub. (3) (a) 2., which shall be
3	used to improve the delivery of those prevention services.
4	(5) Criteria for awarding grants. In addition to any other criteria developed

- 9. - (b) The applicant shall demonstrate in the grant application that it has designated or has plans to designate a staff person to facilitate the activities of the local prevention consortium.
- (c) The applicant shall provide an explanation of its plan to use the grant funds received for the purposes specified in sub. (4).
- (6) Duties of local prevention consortium. A recipient of a planning grant under sub. (3) (b) shall ensure that the local prevention consortium established under sub. (5) (a) does all of the following:
 - (a) Designates the leadership for the local prevention consortium.
 - (b) Convenes at least quarterly.
- (c) Develops goals specific to the area specified by the applicant under sub. (3) (a) 2. that are consistent with the statewide goals developed under sub. (2) (b) and, to the extent possible, uses measures identified under sub. (2) (b) to measure the progress of prevention services toward meeting those goals.
- (d) Identifies prevention services available in the area specified by the applicant under sub. (3) (a) 2. and sources of funding available for prevention services.
- (e) Develops a plan for the coordination of those identified prevention services and sources of funding with the goal of providing comprehensive prevention services in the area specified by the applicant under sub. (3) (a) 2.

Note: The newly created s. 46.505 does the following:

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- 1. Defines "prevention services", "rural area" and "urban area".
- 2. Sets forth the duties of the prevention coordination council.
- 3. Requires DHFS, with the assistance of DPI, to do the following:
- a. Develop a request-for-proposals for prevention planning grants and notify counties of the opportunity to apply.
 - b. Serve as or identify another entity to serve as a state prevention clearinghouse.
- c. Seek waivers of federal funding restrictions and other restrictions under federal laws and as necessary to implement the prevention planning grant program.
 - d. Administer and evaluate the prevention planning grant program.
 - e. Each designate a staff person to carry out the duties under items a. to d., above.
- 4. Sets forth the purpose of the prevention planning grants and the activities for which the grants may be used.
- 5. Sets forth the criteria an applicant must meet in order to receive a prevention planning grant.
- 6. Sets forth the duties of the local prevention consortium that must be established in order to receive a prevention planning grant.

Section 9123. Nonstatutory provisions; health and family services.

(1) Prevention coordination council; initial appointments. Notwithstanding the length of term specified in section 15.197 (3) (b) of the statutes, as created by this act, the initial terms of the member appointed under section 15.197 (3) (a) 12. of the statutes, as created by this act, the member appointed under section 15.197 (3) (a) 13. of the statutes, as created by this act, and one of the members appointed under section 15.197 (3) (a) 14. of the statutes, as created by this act, expire on July 1, 2001; and the initial terms of 2 of the members appointed under section 15.197 (3) (a) 14. of the statutes, as created by this act, expire on July 1, 2000.
