DOC must provide notice of a plan to establish such an office to local law enforcement agencies, the local newspaper and the chief elected official of the municipality in which the office will be located. If requested to do so by the chief elected official, DOC must hold a public hearing on the plan.  The Division of Community Corrections has approximately 120 field offices. In addition, the department is beginning to place staff in neighborhood offices. These offices are normally shared with other governmental units and typically house 1 to 3 agents. The department is also being encouraged to share office space with other state agencies in an effort to become more efficient.  The cost of this provision is directly related to the number of times notice and public hearings would be required. It is unclear how many probation and parole offices will be established or relocated in a given year. Therefore, it is impossible to accurately determine how many notices will be required.
