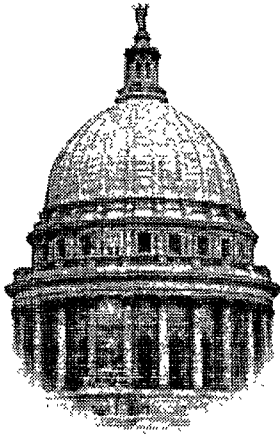

The Substitute Amendment would create three new Public Schools Observance Days: March 17th for the Great Hunger in Ireland from 1845-50, April 24th for the Armenian Genocide from 1915-23 and November 9th for the Holocaust of 1933-45.

March 17th is a traditional day of Irish celebration. April 24th will be the Armenian Genocide Observance Day. November 9th is honored as the day as the official beginning of the Holocaust. It has been referred to Kristallnacht or The Night of Broken Glass.

Please see the attached 1987 Wisconsin Act 11 that perhaps will serve as a model for what I am attempting to achieve.
