Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill designates the second Thursday in July as "Benefit Specialist Day" and requires that the governor issue annually a suitable proclamation for the observance of the day.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 14.16 (10) of the statutes is created to read:
- 4 14.16 (10) Benefit Specialist Day. To recognize the contribution that elderly
- 5 benefit specialists make throughout this state to the well-being of senior citizens,
- 6 many of whom are society's most vulnerable members, the 2nd Thursday in July is
