

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT, TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO 1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 133

At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

- **1.** Page 208, line 3: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 1999–00 by \$175,000 to increase funding for the provision of the trade masters pilot program under section 106.01 (11) of the statutes, as created by this act.
- **2.** Page 208, line 3: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 1999-00 by \$125,000 to increase funding for promotional materials directed at encouraging youth to participate in apprenticeship programs.
 - 3. Page 1080, line 24: after that line insert:

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- **"Section 2005hx.** 106.01 (11) of the statutes is created to read:
- 106.01 **(11)** The department shall provide a trade masters pilot program to recognize advanced training and post-apprenticeship achievements in 3' trades, crafts or businesses, one of which shall be in the industrial sector, one in the

construction sector and one in the service sector of the economy. By July 1, 2003, the department shall submit to the legislature under s. 13.172 (2) an evaluation of the effectiveness of the pilot program in producing workers with advanced skills beyond the apprentice level.".



AN ACT ...; relating to: apprenticeship training and making appropriations.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the department of workforce development (DWD) may determine reasonable apprenticeship classifications, promulgate rules, issue general or special orders, hold hearings, make findings and render orders as necessary to oversee the apprenticeship programs provided in this state.

This bill directs DWD to provide a trade masters pilot program to recognize advanced training and post-apprenticeship achievements in three trades, crafts or businesses, one of which must be in the industrial sector, one in the construction sector and one in the service sector of the economy In addition the bill provides funding for the provision of that program and for promotional materials directed at encouraging youth to participate in apprenticeship programs. Finally, the bill requires DWD to submit to the legislature, by July 1, 2003, an evaluation of the effectiveness of the trade masters pilot program in producing workers with advanced skills beyond the apprentice level.

- (2) Apprenticeship promotional materials. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of workforce development under section 20.435 (3) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1999, the dollar amount is increased by \$125,000 for fiscal year 1999-00 to provide promotional materials directed at encouraging youth to participate in apprenticeship programs.


