International Baccalaureate Diploma Program Scholarship

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Motion:

Move to create a new, sum sufficient GPR appropriation within HEAB for scholarships to public and private high school students who successfully complete the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program and receive an **IB** Diploma when they graduate from high school. Under the scholarship program, which would be administered by HEAB, each student who earns an international baccalaureate diploma would be eligible to receive a scholarship of \$500 for each year the student is enrolled in a participating postsecondary institution in Wisconsin. In order to receive the scholarship, a, student would have to enroll at a participating postsecondary institution in Wisconsin on a full-time basis, by September 30 of the academic year immediately following the school year in which the student received the II3 Diploma. A student would continue to receive the scholarship for each year he or she is enrolled full-time at an eligible postsecondary institution, maintains at least a 3.000 grade point average, or the equivalent as determined by the postsecondary institution, and makes satisfactory progress toward an associate or bachelor's degree. A student would be eligible to receive the scholarship for up to four years if the student attends a UW System institution or private college or for up to three years if the student attends a Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) institution. The scholarship could not be used to replace any other grant for which a student would be eligible.

Specify that each UW System institution, WTCS institution and private college that wishes. to participate in the program would be required to notify HEAB by October 1, 1999 of its intention to participate, If an institution that has notified the Board of its intent to participate subsequently wishes to no longer participate in the program, the institution would be required to notify HEAB of its intent in writing by October 1 prior to the academic year in which the institution would no longer participate. Specify that half of each \$500 scholarship would be funded by the state and half would be funded by the postsecondary institution in which the student enrolls. Permit UW System institutions to satisfy the matching requirement by tuition remissions.

Require the Executive Secretary of HEAB to promulgate rules for the program.

Note:

This motion would create a new scholarship program, to be administered by HEAB, for public and private high school students who obtain an International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma. Under the program, scholarships of \$500 each would be awarded to students who enroll on a full-time basis at an eligible postsecondary institution in the state and would continue to be awarded to the student for each year that the student meets certain criteria, up to a maximum of four years for students enrolled at UW System institutions or private institutions and up to three years for students enrolled at WTCS institutions. Half of the scholarship amount would be funded by the state and half would be funded by the institution. Funding for the state's share of the scholarships would be provided in a new, sum sufficient GPR appropriation within HEAB. Postsecondary institutions would be required to notify HEAB of their intent to participate in the program. HEAB would be required to promulgate rules for the administration of the program.

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Program is a rigorous pre-university course of studies taken by a student in his or her junior and senior years in high school. The curriculum is not modeled after that of any particular country, but is intended to allow a student to fulfill requirements of various national education systems. A student must take courses in six subject areas and pass an examination in each in order to complete the program. In addition, the student required to participate in community service or other extracurricular activities and write a **4,000**-word essay. Currently, three high schools in the state offer the program and a fourth is planning to begin offering the program within the next two years. It is not known how many students are currently enrolled in these programs or how many students have obtained the IB diploma. Therefore, the fiscal effect of this motion cannot be determined.

### 1999 BILL

AN ACT ...; relating to: creating an International Baccalaureate Diploma grant program, granting rule-making authority and making an appropriation.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a grant program, administered by the higher educational aids board (HEAB), for high school students who received an International Baccalaureate Diploma (awarded to graduating high school seniors who have fulfilled requirements of various national education systems). A student who has earned the diploma is eligible to receive an annual grant in the amount of \$250 from HEAB and a matching grant from a participating University of Wisconsin System institution, a technical college or a private institution of higher education located in Wisconsin if the student is enrolled full time at the institution, maintains at least a 3.0 grade point average and makes satisfactory progress towards an associate or a bachelor's degree.

For further information see the **state** fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 20.235 (1) (fz) of the statutes is created to read:
- 20.235 **(1)** (fz) *International Baccalaureate Diploma grant program.* A sum sufficient for grants to students under s. 39.415.

- (a) The student received an International Baccalaureate Diploma when he or she graduated from high school.
- (b) By September 30 of the academic year immediately following the school year in which the student received the diploma under par. (a), the student enrolled full time at an institution participating in the program under this section.
- (c) The student remains enrolled at a participating institution and maintains at least a 3.0 grade point average, or the equivalent as determined by that institution.
- (d) The student makes satisfactory progress towards an associate or a bachelor's degree, as determined by the board.
- (2) (a) Each institution of the University of Wisconsin System, each district school of the technical college system and each private institution of higher education located in this state that wishes to participate in the grant program under this section shall notify the board by October 1 before the academic year in which the institution wishes to participate, If an institution that has notified the board under this paragraph no longer wishes to participate in the grant program, the institution shall notify the board of this fact in writing by October 1 before the academic year in which the institution will no longer participate.
- (b) A participating institution shall award a matching grant of \$250 to each student who receives a grant under sub. (3). An institution of the University of Wisconsin System may award a matching grant under this paragraph by a waiver of academic fees established under s. 36.27.

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- (3) From the appropriation under s. 20.235 (1) (fz), annually the board shall award each eligible student under sub. (1) a grant of \$250. An eligible student who is enrolled in a participating institution of the University of Wisconsin System or a participating private institution of higher education may receive a grant under this Isubsection for no more than 4 'academic years. An eligible student who is enrolled in a participating district school of the technical college system may receive a grant under this subsection for no more than 3 academic years.
- (4) Neither the board nor a participating institution may supplant any other grant for which a student may be eligible with a grant under this section.
  - (5) The board sh 1 promulgate rules to implement and administer this section.
