Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

This bill changes the procedure for judicial review of alcohol beverage licensing actions in 1st class cities (currently only Milwaukee). The bill limits the evidence the reviewing court may consider to the records of the common council and its alcohol licensing committee, if any, relating to the action being challenged. The bill also stipulates that the court must defer to the committee's or common council's determination of facts and may not delay enforcement of the common council's action pending its review.

The bill also requires a 1st class city to issue a temporary license to a person who makes a late application to renew a valid Class "A", "Class A", Class "B" or "Class B" license and pays \$1,500.

The bill has no state fiscal effect.
