Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate <p>1999 Act 9 removed the court's authority to suspend a defendant's drivers license for failure to pay a fine or forfeiture in non-traffic offenses. This bill restores the court's authority to suspend the drivers license of a juvenile for failure to pay in a non-traffic offense.</p> <p>Presently, circuit and municipal courts have some ways of dealing with juveniles who refuse to pay including: suspending hunting and fishing licenses, community service, bringing a contempt motion to find the payor in contempt of court; or bringing an action against the payor to obtain a judgment that could be collected by garnishment or execution. None of these are viewed by the courts as being as effective in collecting the unpaid monies as the drivers license. They also would require more judge, prosecutor and court staff time if they are used. It is expected that under this bill court time will be saved and additional fine and forfeiture monies will be collected. It is impossible to predict the actual savings with the data available.</p>		
Long-Range Fiscal Implications It is expected that there may be a shift in the juvenile ordinance violation caseload from municipal court to circuit court because of the lack of alternative methods of dealing with juveniles in the municipal courts. The actions may be brought as forfeitures and in some cases as misdemeanors.
