- 1. Please review the definition of "night vision equipment" carefully. I developed this definition from a suggested definition supplied by Gary Homuth of DNR. Although I revised the definition somewhat to make it simpler to follow, I want to be sure that the definition is accurate.
- 2. Under current law, in s. 29.314 (2), there is a presumption that a person casting the rays of light on a field, forest or other area which is frequented by wild animals is shining wild animals. Do you want to create a similar presumption for a person that uses night vision equipment in an area frequented by wild animals?
- 3. Under current law, in s. 29.314 (5) (b) 4., there is an exception to the prohibition against shining wild animals between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. from September 15 to December 31 that allows DNR to promulgate rules permitting a person to shine wild animals during this period. Do you want to allow DNR to promulgate rules that would also permit a person to use night vision equipment during this period?
- 4. Under current law, in s. 29.314 (6), a county may regulate or prohibit the shining of wild animals. Do you want this provision also to apply to persons who use night vision equipment?
