Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

This bill changes the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) regulatory structure as it relates to captive wildlife. Under current law, DNR must request certification from the Department of Revenue on whether applicants for licenses to possess captive wildlife are liable for delinquent taxes; DNR denies or revokes the license of any applicant who is delinquent. This bill does not appear to change this arrangement, so it is not believed to have any effect on state delinquent tax collections.
