This bill makes it a misdemeanor to withhold a child from his or her parent for more than three hours or to withhold a child from his or her legal custodian for more than three hours beyond a court-approved period of physical placement or visitation. Because this bill creates new crimes, the State Public Defender's Office (SPD) will likely handle additional cases, thus increasing costs. Because it is unknown how many people would be charged with these new crimes and, of those charged, how many would qualify for SPD assistance, the agency cannot estimate the costs at this time. The SPD has no data from which to estimate local government costs.						
Long-Range Fiscal Implications Indeterminate at this time. Agency would monitor fiscal effect of this bill, if enacted, for future budget considerations.
