Pgl LnlAn Act to create 895.523 of the statutes; relating to: immunity of private<br/>campground owners and operators.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau



This bill provides immunity from civil liability to owners and operators of private campgrounds and to their employes and agents. The immunity applies to property damage or personal injury or death of an individual if the damage, injury or death is the proximate result of the act or omission of a person other than the owner or operator of the private campground or the employes or agents of the owner or operator.
