Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Funding

Draft as bill — [LFB Paper #1101] fund only for 2nd yr of the biennium

Motion:

Move to provide \$2,419,000 FED annually to be distributed as follows: (a) \$2,158,000 annually to be transferred from DWD to DHFS to fund an expansion of the child abuse and neglect prevention grants to 14 rural counties, six urban counties and three tribes; and (b) \$261,000 to be placed in the Committee's program supplements appropriation for technical assistance and training for the DE-IFS grant program. Require DHFS to submit a request under a 14-day passive approval process for release of the funds. Specify that the request must include documentation of the need for these funds.

*Increase FED DWD
Increase PR DHFS*

Note:

This motion would provide \$2,158,000 annually in federal TANF funds to be transferred from DWD to DHFS to expand the DHFS child abuse and neglect prevention grant program established in 1997 Wisconsin Act 378. Currently, programs are funded in six rural counties, three urban counties and one tribe.

Additionally, \$261,000 annually would be placed in the Committee's appropriation for technical assistance and training to counties and tribes receiving DHFS child abuse and neglect prevention grants. Currently, DHFS is budgeted \$160,000 GPR for this purpose.

Under this motion, the amount of TANF funds budgeted in the bill would be increased by \$2,419,000 FED annually. The program revenue increase reflects the transfer of TANF funds from DWD to DHFS (\$2,158,000 PR annually).

Under current law, the department of health and family services (DHFS) administers a child abuse and neglect prevention program ~~Under which DHFS~~ awards grants to counties and Indian tribes that offer home visitation services to first-time parents who are eligible for medical assistance and that offer services to families that have been the subject of a child abuse or neglect report, or that have requested services to prevent child abuse or neglect, and that are at substantial risk of future child abuse or neglect, are willing to cooperate with an informal plan of support and services and are not likely to be the subject of a formal child in need of protection or services proceeding. Currently, no more than six rural counties, three urban counties and two Indian tribes may be selected to participate in the program. This bill authorizes no more than 20 rural counties, nine urban counties and five Indian tribes to participate in the program and provides additional funding for that program expansion.


