SUBJECT: Statutory Modifications

You recently requested that I provide potential drafts for two pieces of legislation. The first would be designed to ensure that park receipts were used for park purposes. Since ch. 27, Stats., receipts deal with more than the Parks program, and the legislature has not created a statutory Parks account, it was difficult to draft a piece of legislation focusing only on the Parks program.

I looked to s. 27.01(7)(h), Stats., which already contains the statement that vehicle admission receipts, credited to the Conservation Fund, shall be "used for the state parks, state recreation areas, recreation" areas in State forests, and the Bong area lands." It is my view that a broader-based protection of ch. 27, Stats., receipts is needed. Therefore, I drafted language for s. 25.29, Stats., which parallels the protective language for monies received from license fees paid by hunters and fishers. My suggestion follows:

Funds deposited in the Conservation Fund from receipts under s. 27.01(7) through (lo), shall not be diverted for any other purpose, other than those provided by the Department.

The reference to "purpose other than those provided by the Department", is the same language used for hunting and fishing fees. It has proven more successful in protecting these accounts than the already existing language in 27.01(7)(h), Stats., has been in protecting yours.

You also requested that I provide language which would allow for the use of agents to sell park stickers, who could retain up to 20% of the gross amount of the vehicle admission receipts. Due to the number of sections which would need to be modified, I did not provide an actual draft, but rather the outline of necessary changes. I believe the following outline is all that is necessary for the drafters to create the necessary changes:

- 1. Modify admission fees in s. 27.01(7)(f),(g) and (gm), to incorporate the issuing fees authorized by s. 27.01(7)(gr), which will thereby reflect the amounts we actually charge.
- 2. Delete s. 27.01(7)(gr), which establishes the issuing fee of \$.50 for each annual vehicle admission receipt, and \$. 15 for each daily.

3. Modify s. 27.01(7m)(b), to allow the agent to retain admission fees

prefer \$ 18 in state - agent keeps 10%.

delde, 15 for daily a charge to \$5.00

Section 27.01(7m)(c), Stats., already contains rule authorization to regulate the activities of authorized agents. If necessary, we could create rules creating standards to be used to determine what percentage, up





to 20%, should be retained by each agent.

Under current law, a person may not operate a vehicle in & state park unless state the vehicle has been issued a vehicle admission receipt by the department of natural resources (DNR). The base fee for the receipt varies depending upon whether the fee is issued on an annual or daily basis and depending on the kind of vehicle for which the receipt is issued. 



Thank you for your interest in this topic. We appreciate your willingness to expand sales potential for park products.

Below I have summarized the current sales channels for state park vehicle admission stickers and trail passes. I have also attached a price list detailing all of the resident and non-resident fees for 2000.

Line 8 - In describing the groups who can qualify for the 10% commission, there is a discrepancy in what you have defined ad non-profit and our current definitions within our program. We historically have defined Friends Groups as nonstock, nonprofit corporation described under Section 501 (C) (3) or (4) of the Internal Revenue Code and exempt from taxation under section 501(a). I would suggest you consider adding the (4) classification.

Line 10 - The language regarding the 10% has been very hard for people to understand. I do not know if it can be re-written but many people I have asked to read and interpret the wording perform the following calculation:

We want to make sure that the non-profit group would not be eligible for more than 10% of the retail. price, which in the above example would be \$1.80.

I have also attached a copy of the application process that our Friends Groups use when applying for matching grants. If we want to control the number of non-profit groups that are involved in these sales, I would envision an application process that could be modeled after this packet. Step number 6 of the application process could be structured to give added emphasis to existing Friends Groups, non-profit groups with a recreation or environmental education focus, etc.

1999 BILL

AN ACT to amend 27.01 (7m) (b); and to create 27.01 (7m) (bm) of the statutes; relating to: fees for vehicle admission receipts for entry into state parks and

other state recreational lands.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person may not operate a vehicle in state parks or certain other state recreational lands unless the vehicle has been issued a vehicle admission receipt by the department of natural resources (DNR). The base fee for the receipt varies depending upon whether the fee is issued on an annual or daily basis and depending on the kind of vehicle for which the receipt is issued. In addition to the base fee, DNR collects an issuing fee of 50 cents for each annual vehicle admission receipt issued and an issuing fee of 15 cents for each daily vehicle admission receipt issued. DNR may appoint agents to collect all of these fees and the agent may retain the issuing fees as compensation for the agent's services.

This bill provides that if DNR appoints an agent to issue vehicle admission receipts, and the agent is a nonprofit corporation, that agent may retain an amount that is equal to ten percent of the sum of the amount of the base fee for the receipt plus 50 cents or 15 cents depending on whether the receipt issued is for annual or daily admission. The bill does not change the amount under current law that an agent other than a nonprofit corporation may retain as compensation for the agent's services.
