#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a group health insurance policy (called a "disability insurance policy" in the statutes) that provides coverage of any inpatient hospital services must provide coverage of inpatient hospital services for the treatment of nervous and mental disorders and alcoholism and other drug abuse problems in the minimum amount of \$7,000, minus any applicable cost sharing at the level charged

under the policy, or the expenses of 30 days of inpatient services, whichever is less. If a group health insurance policy provides coverage of any outpatient hospital services, it must provide coverage of outpatient hospital services for the treatment of nervous and mental disorders and alcoholism and other drug abuse problems in the minimum amount of \$2,000, minus any applicable cost sharing at the level charged under the policy. If a group health insurance policy provides coverage of any inpatient or outpatient hospital services, it must provide coverage of transitional services for the treatment of nervous and mental disorders and alcoholism and other drug abuse problems in the minimum amount of \$3,000, minus any applicable cost sharing at the level charged under the policy. (Transitional services are services, specified by rule by the commissioner of insurance, that are provided in a less restrictive manner than inpatient services but in a more intensive manner than outpatient services.) If a group health insurance policy provides coverage for both inpatient and outpatient hospital services, the total coverage for all types of treatment for nervous and mental disorders and alcoholism and other drug abuse problems need not exceed \$7,000 in a policy year.

This bill removes the specified minimum amounts of coverage that a group health insurance policy must provide for the treatment of nervous and mental disorders and alcoholism and other drug abuse problems but retains the requirements with respect to providing the coverage. Except for group plans offered by limited service health organizations, the bill specifically applies the requirements to all types of group health benefit plans, including managed care plans, insurance plans offered by the state and self-insured health plans of the state and municipalities.

In addition, the bill imposes a new requirement that the coverage under group health benefit plans and self-insured health plans for the treatment of nervous and mental disorders and alcoholism and other drug abuse problems must be the same as the coverage under those plans for the treatment of physical conditions. This requirement applies to such coverage components as deductibles, copayments, annual and lifetime limits and medical necessity definitions. The bill does not require individual health benefit plans to cover the treatment of nervous or mental disorders or alcoholism or other drug abuse problems but, if an individual health benefit plan does cover the treatment of any of those conditions, the individual health benefit plan must provide the same coverage for that treatment as it does for the treatment of physical conditions.
