**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:**

AB 808 expands the prohibition of current law to prohibit the transfer for valuable consideration of human body parts, including cells and tissue, for any purpose, and expands the prohibition to the fetal cells and tissue.

If adopted, AB 808 might well have adverse impact on some transplantation and research, such as stem cell and bone marrow transplantation, and stem cell medical research. The costs associated with the adverse effect on those programs are best left to the University.

Beyond that recommendation, we don't believe the Department of Justice will be fiscally impacted. The state may be involved in litigation but defending that type of action would fall within our normal duties and should be able to be absorbed through our Legal Services Division.
