Local Fiscal Effects: Under current law, all receipts from national forest land must be distributed to school districts in accordance with the number of acres of national forest land that are located within the school district boundaries.  In the 1999-2000 school year, this bill would require that all receipts from national forest land must be distributed to towns in accordance with the number of acres of national forest land that are located within the towns' boundaries.  In addition, the bill requires the secretary of the Department of Natural Resources to make a one time appropriation of \$905,800 GPR and \$900,000 SEG to school districts that contain national forest lands within their boundaries. The distribution of funds to each school district must reflect the proportion of national forest acreage located within the school district.  While this bill would reimburse school districts for the loss of national forest land revenue for one year, school districts would experience a permanent loss of revenue in future years.
